Biographies and Program Notes

Voices of Children Foundation

Olena Rozvadovska is an expert in the field of protection of children's rights, head of the "Voices of Children" charitable foundation. Since 2019, she is the founder and head of the "Voices of Children" Charitable Foundation. In 2015, after the start of armed aggression against Ukraine, she moved to Donbas and implemented a number of programs to protect children who became victims of the armed conflict. From 2011 to 2015, she worked as a press secretary of the Plenipotentiary of the President of Ukraine on Children's Rights. She collaborated with documentary projects about children in Eastern Ukraine. Among the latter is the documentary "A House Made of Splinters" by the Danish film company Final Cut for Real. She received the "Human Rights Agenda" award for her personal contribution to the protection of human rights in Ukraine in 2017. Participant of the leadership program of the US State Department, "Women Leaders: Promoting Peace and Security" in 2016. Graduated from National University of Food Technologies, Faculty of Economics (2001-2008)

Violetta Horbachova, 14 years old. A Ukrainian girl was born in Nova Kakhovka and has lived there till July 2022. Her town has been occupied since the first day of the full-scale invasion of Russia. She was forced to flee to Odesa, and now she's got a new life there. Violetta is creative, smart, patriotic and friendly. She loves painting, crocheting, listening to music, volunteering, studying, and being with her close people. Also, she's been going to drama club and making solo and group performances since she was 8 years old. Art is an important chapter of her life and plans for the future. Ukraine is a huge piece of her heart, and she's very proud to be part of her brave and glorious nation.

Sabri Ramazanov is 14 and lives in Bucha, Ukraine. His family moved there 8 years ago from Simferopol, Crimea. He has always been an active child, that is why sport is an integral part of his life. He used to play in football and basketball teams, and now he is engaged in athletics. He purely adores creativity! Throughout his studies at music school, he created guitar covers and showed them to his friends, and published them on social media. He continues to work on them now:) He was also engaged in Crimean Tatar dances in the cultural center, concerts always filled him with positive emotions. He is always glad to create something new, so now he is studying programming to create applications that make human life easier, comfortable and simple.

Tamia Rivera is a 9th Grade student at North Central High School in Indianapolis where she is a member of the Festival Orchestra playing the cello. However, her main instrument is the piano which she has studied since she was 6 years old under the teaching of Ann Sloan.

Aidan Weiss has taken violin and music theory since the age of four and began piano lessons under the teaching of Ann Sloan at the age of 12. He is now 15 years old and attends Fishers High School where his favorite subject is math.

Canu Yn Ein Calon - Singing In Our Hearts International Virtual Choir

Ceri Jones, Musical Director, gained a BMus Hons degree from the University College of North Wale, Bangor, where she had her first taste of Musical Directing with the Gilbert and Sullivan Society. Ceri was Musical Director for Chepstow Amateur Operatic Society for almost 10 years and worked briefly with Concept Players, South Wales and Caldicot Amateur Operatic Society. A lengthy break from music was ended during the first Covid lockdown in 2020 when Ceri joined Great British Home Chorus, a virtual choir set up by British Choirmaster, Gareth Malone and she then became Musical Director for the Welsh Regional Group, which was prolific in writing and recording music under her directorship. Ceri recently left this Group and has set up Canu Yn Ein Calon - Singing In Our Hearts with her good friend and co-founder, Lena, with whom she also enjoys recording duets.

Lena Izzat, Assistant Musical Director, is a Consultant Cardiologist and Physician working in South West Wales. She has been in choir since early childhood, singing both classic and contemporary repertoire. Since the start of the pandemic, she has participated in well over 250 choral projects with 47 virtual choirs and says that music is her heartbeat. Lena and Ceri met through Great British Home Chorus and the Welsh Regional Group and became good friends after Lena suggested singing some duets. Lena has recorded several solos which are posted on Facebook or YouTube and recently sang a solo at the face-to-face concert of Sing Out Strong in Hereford, England. Lena's experience in producing videos to accompany her solos has led to her becoming audio editor for Canu Yn Ein Calon - Singing In Our Hearts.

Anna writes:

I wrote Harbour two years ago in response to the Syrian refugee crisis. With the appalling response by the British press and government to the tragedies that were happening at sea, I felt mine was a lonely voice in wanting a more welcoming and compassionate country to live in. I wrote the song so that others with similar opinions to me could sing together and know that they were not alone and that together we could change our society for the better. Harbour is more popular than ever now that the people of the world are feeling driven to help the millions of refugees fleeing Ukraine. I would like my song to help all of those fleeing war zones. Soon we will be welcoming more refugees into our countries and my hope is that my song will help ensure they are met with warmth, compassion and generosity. So please keep singing and sharing it. Keep campaigning to reduce the unnecessary bureaucracy that prevents people from finding a safe passage into our countries. Thank you for your belief in the power of song."

The Melody by Myroslav Skoryk Olga Aidinova, pianist (Ukraine)

This piece is the spiritual hymn of Ukraine. The Melody reflects everything the people are feeling during this period...despite being written 40 years ago.

Olga Aidinova. I am a resident of Kiev, Ukraine, now living temporarily in Vienna, Austria. I started learning to play the piano at the age of 5 years. My parents aren't musicians, but the world of Music attracted me since my childhood. Except for the classics, I liked to play my favorite songs and various popular instrumental music, as well. Especially I loved to play some pieces from an album of American composer and pianist, David Lanz. My father had brought for me two cassettes of him from a business trip to USA. For a long time, both were my favorites, and I could listen to it nonstop.

It was the times, when there were no scores of all the music that I liked, so usually I used to play it by ear. But since I've realized that my skills are not enough, I decided to get the music education. I was really happy when I took the first step to my dream to become a musician, starting my studying at the R. Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music, and some years after - at The National Academy of Music after P.Tchaikovsky at the class of the piano, and after - the postgraduate at the class of the chamber ensemble. Now I work with a students of the R.Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music as a concertmaster.

But also, I've always been interested in experimenting with different styles of music, mixing them together. That's why for many years I played in bands with different line-ups: from instrumental sympho-rock band (strings+keyboards+drums) to heavy-metal band. Everywhere I used to bring a lot of classical elements there, which made it possible to get a new sound. It was a good experience for me in creating arrangements. As well I like the instrumental piano music, so I work on my solo project, which includes my author's piano arrangements of various popular songs.

And since the war begun in my country, I've focused on arrangements of Ukrainian songs to popularize the Ukrainian music in the World. Staying abroad with my little daughter this period because of the war, I could find my way to make my contribution to our Victory. So, I started my action: "buy the sheet music and make the victory closer," where most of the proceeds from the sale of the scores go to the needs of the Armed Forces of Ukraine.

Myroslav Skoryk (1938-2020)

One of the most notable contemporary Ukrainian composers, he is the author of a very diverse and impressive oeuvre. Although contemporary in its vocabulary and means of expression, his music often draws from the rich well of Ukrainian folklore. Skoryk was born in 1938 in Lviv. His exceptional musical talent was recognized in his childhood by his great aunt, the famous opera singer Solomiia Krushelnytska, who encouraged Myroslav's parents to enrol him in a music school in 1945. However, his education was interrupted in 1947 when, during the wave of postwar Stalinist repressions, the Skoryk family was arrested by the Soviet authorities and exiled to Siberia. Skoryk was able to return to <u>Lviv</u> only in 1955, after <u>Joseph Stalin</u>'s death. He graduated (1960) from the <u>Lviv</u> Conservatory in the classes of Adam Soltys, Stanyslav Liudkevych, and Roman Simovych and then completed graduate studies (1964) at the Moscow Conservatory in the composition class of Dmitri Kabalevsky. He subsequently lectured in composition at the Lviv Conservatory (1964–6) and the Kyiv Conservatory (1966–88), returning to Lviv in 1988. He lived and worked in Australia between 1996 and 1999. Since 1999 Skoryk has been professor of the history of Ukrainian music at the National Music Academy of Ukraine and since 2002 he has been artistic director of the Kyiv Music Fest international music festival. In 2004-10 he was co-head (with Yevhen Stankovych) of the National Union of Composers of Ukraine. Since 2011 Skoryk has been artistic director of the National Opera of Ukraine. He was awarded the Shevchenko Prize in 1987. From 1960 to 1964 he studied at the Moscow Conservatory in the doctoral program with the celebrated Dmitri Kabalevsky. Upon graduation, he joined the faculty of the Lviv Conservatory and, in 1967, the Kyiv Conservatory, where he remained as professor of composition until 1988. In 1968, Skoryk was selected to be the secretary of the Ukrainian Union of Composers and, in 1988, he became the head of the Lviv branch of this same organization. He is the winner of the prestigious Shevchenko Prize and holds the title "People's Artist of Ukraine". After the death of Borys Lyatoshynsky in 1968, Skoryk, despite his young age, became one of Ukraine's most important professors of composition. His many students include such prominent contemporary composers as Stankovych, Karabyts, Kyva, Ilyin and Balakauskas.

Myroslav Skoryk lived in both Kyiv and Lviv, Ukraine, and travelled frequently to concertise and lecture in Europe, the United States, Canada and Australia. He spent the last years of his life in Kyiv. Mr. Skoryk passed away on June 1, 2020 in the capital of his homeland. Skoryk's works are regularly performed not only in his native Ukraine, and the other republics of the former Soviet Union, but throughout Europe, and in recent years, in North and South America, Canada, Great Britain, Australia, Japan and indeed, worldwide. Among his most popular compositions are the Concerto for Orchestra (Carpathian); the Hutsul Tryptich; Violin Concertos Nos.1 & 2; Piano Concertos Nos.1 & 2; the Cello Concerto and the Sonatas for Violin and Piano. The composer has also written music for some 40 films, of which the best known is "Shadows of Forgotten Ancestors". He also wrote jazz and popular music.

"The Melody"

One of the most famous of his works is "The Melody", which became his hallmark later.

Skoryk composed it for the Soviet war film "Vysokyy pereval" ("The High Pass"). Set in Galicia in the aftermath of World War II, the film was subjected to Soviet censorship and negatively depicted Ukrainian nationalism. Skoryk, who composed the work at the request of the film's director, Volodymyr Denysenko, later said that although other composers had turned down the offer to compose the film's score, he wanted to create music to subvertively convey the film's tragic and emotional themes. As he said in one of his interviews, he worked on Melody for a long time, because he wanted to put into it all the feelings associated with the suffering of the Ukrainian people. It was originally scored for flute and piano but has since been arranged for many other instrumentations. Melody is Skoryk's most popular work and is frequently performed in concerts, including in response to the 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine. It is frequently described as a spiritual hymn of Ukraine, and has been used in commemorations of the Holodomor and the Revolution of Dignity. In response to the 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine, Melody has been widely performed internationally in benefit concerts and other settings. During a virtual address by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to the United States Congress in March 2022, it accompanied a video of the destruction in Ukraine. The work is part of the concert program of the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra during their tour in Europe, selected for its recognizability and sentimentality.

This piece is a Ukrainian children's song-game, to celebrate spring, usually accompanied by movement that corresponds to the words, much like London Bridge, or similar. At the outbreak of war in Ukraine in 2022, Victoria Voronyansky, wanting to reach out through music, arranged this and made it freely available online for musicians. Victoria is Ukrainian and sought asylum in the U.S. years ago when she was 13, and now teaches violin and viola.

From Olga Aidinova: The author of the Ukrainian song that Georg sings - Ihor Poklad - had to stay with his family into the basement of his country house near Kyiv during the first 2 weeks of the war, while their village was occupied by the Russian army? He is over 80+, and there was no information, no communication with them for all the time that they were there. Nobody even knew if they are alive, and do they have any food supplies. We all were really disturbed and were thinking how could anybody help them. To take them out of there was very very very dangerous, because russians could shoot cars and passers-by. They killed civilians just like that. Among the killed people were also volunteers who drived there to helped to the others. But one day a man named Konstantin red the post in Facebook about the Poklad family, and decided to take them out of there. He took a big risk, but there was hope that his Kazakhstan's passport can help him to pass all the roadblocks of the occupiers. Thanks God, he could take them out. And in the similar way he took out of there more than 200 people. After Vorzel had been liberated, Poklads came back to their house and discovered that the occupiers lived in their house while owners were away. They made a mess there and when they left it, they mined the house, one of the mines was under the piano. Ukrainian soldiers had cleared the mines after.

Alexander Boldachev is a virtuoso-harpist, composer, exclusive artist of Italian harp house Salvi Harps, initiator of the World Harp Day, founder of Zurich Harp Festival, co-founder of community "LYUDY", instructor at Zakhar Bron School of Music. Laureate of more than a dozen prestigious international competitions, including composing competitions; awarded by the "Britain's Brilliant Prodigies", "Aoyama Music Award" in Kyoto, "Pro Europa" in Austria, presented by Heinz Fischer for high achievements in the field of culture; Fellow of the international foundations Vontobel in Switzerland and Banque Populaire in France, as well as the Russian foundations for the development of young musicians Spivakov, Temirkanov, the Rotary Club and Houses of Music that gave a start to his career. Laureate of the Prix Walo television award in Switzerland. Plays the harp, piano and writes music from the age of five. Travels with solo concerts around the world, leads master classes at such educational institutions as the Royal Conservatory in Toronto, Juilliard School in New York, Royal Academy in London, Ferenc Liszt Academy in Budapest. Fleeing from Bucha, Tatiana wasn't able to take her scores, but she and Evgeniy Spiridonov reconstructed the Ukrainian repertoire she was working on before the war and added some in German and English.

Evgeniy Spiridonov is a pianist, conductor, teacher and organist. He was born in Belarus, graduated from the Republican College and the Academy of Music in Belarus as a pianist. Earned a Master of Music Performance from the Zurich University of the Arts and a Master of Arts in Music Education from the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts. for the last ten years he has been studying and working in Switzerland. Since March of this year, he and his fellow musicians including Tatiana Severnvhuk and Alexandr Boldachev have organized a Sunday music school for refugee children from Ukraine who are now living temporarily in Zurich. *Music is a truly universal human language. Music is an integral part of almost everyone's life. I have been practicing music professionally since my early childhood and I can safely say that music is my life.*

Roman Surzha (born Sep 8, 1960), is a contemporary Ukrainian composer. He has done work for movies, and, being a good friend and an old peer of Shchedryk's conductor, Marianna Sablina, has written many piece exclusively for Shchedryk. The Bunny Walks is an arrangement of a Ukrainian folk song, a lullaby, done by Roman Surzha for Shchedryk choir.

Marianna Sablina, Artistic Director, was born in 1961 in Kyiv, Ukraine. In 1971, she began singing in the Shchedryk choir, founded by her mother, Iryna Sablina. In 1977, Marianna Sablina became the choirmaster of Shchedryk. In 1981, Marianna entered the National Music Academy of Ukraine named after P.I. Tchaikovsky, where she studied in the class of choral conducting under the guidance of Professor L. N. Venediktov. After graduating from NMAU in 1986, she continued her work as a choirmaster in Shchedryk choir. Since 2003, Marianna has been the artistic director and chief conductor of the choir. In 2005, she was awarded the Golden Diploma of the 1st International Choir Competition "Musica Sacra a Roma" as the best conductor. In 2018, Marianna received the Golden David (prize for the best choir of the festival) and the Special Prize "Best Conductor" of the 7th Florence International Choral Festival.

Shchedryk Children Choir was founded in 1971 in Kyiv by master of choral art Iryna Sablina. Since 2003, the artistic director and chief conductor of the collective is the Honored Artist of Ukraine Marianna Sablina. Today, the choir has more than 150 children of various ages, who participate in the respective age groups. About 55 best performers are part of the concert lineup. Over the 50 years of the choir's existence, more than 2,000 choristers have "graduated" from Shchedryk. The repertoire of Shchedryk includes music of the Renaissance, baroque, classical music, arrangements of Ukrainian songs and songs of the peoples of the world, works of modern domestic and foreign composers. Since the beginning of the 70s of the last century, the choir has been touring with solo concerts in the philharmonic halls of the republics of the USSR: Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Moldova, Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia. In the 1990s, Shchedryk became a discovery for the world music community, and within three decades the choir received the highest awards in all international competitions in which it participated. The choir toured successfully in 15 US states, many cities in Canada, Germany, Poland, Austria, Switzerland, as well as in Belgium, the Netherlands, France, Sweden, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia.

Shchedryk had the honor of singing in joint projects with outstanding musicians of the world, such as: Volodymyr Krainev, Gidon Kremer, Anton Sharoev, Roman Kofman, Gia Kancheli, Ivan Monighetti, Daniel Barenboim, Marta Argerich and others. Ovations in honor of "Schedryk" were heard in the most famous music halls:

Colonnade Hall named after M. Lysenko of the National Philharmonic of Ukraine; Musikverein in Vienna, Austria; Chamber Hall of the Berlin Philharmonic; Konzerthaus in Vienna, Austria; Mozarteum in Salzburg; Beethovenhalle in Bonn; Roy Thomson in Toronto; Gasteig in Munich; Forum in Leverkusen; The Great Hall of the Moscow Conservatory named after P.I. Tchaikovsky

The first three recordings of Shchedryk were made by the "Melody" company on vinyl records. Part of the Shchedryk repertoire is presented on 5 CDs recorded in Ukraine. The German company "Deutsche Welle" released the Shchedryk Christmas concert in Bonn. An honorable place in the choir's discography is occupied by Olivier Messiaen's Three Little Liturgies, performed by Shchedryk together with the Kremerata Baltica orchestra under the direction of R. Kofman, which was included in the collection of the best concerts in the history of the Gidon Kremer Chamber Music Festival.

World Children's Choir

The World Children's Choir serves as a voice for children worldwide — giving voice to the interests of all children, celebrating cultural diversity through music, promoting positive international relations, and asking people to work together to create a peaceful, healthy world for children. Through singing, the children learn how music and art expresses emotion, creates shared experiences, bridges differences, tells stories, produces beauty and enriches others. The World Children's Choir is concerned about the children of the world and the future they face. By pursuing our mission we believe that we contribute to building a world of peaceful respect, friendship, cooperation, and prosperity among nations. We believe that working together to produce beautiful music and other kinds of art enables the children to create friendships based on mutual understanding and respect. By bringing children from many cultures and nations together in song today, we can sow the seeds of a more peaceful world tomorrow. The choir has been appointed to the Artists Roster of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Performances have been given for former U. S. Presidents George W. Bush, Bill Clinton, and George H. W. Bush and President Barack Obama; Queen Noor of Jordan, Queen Sofia of Spain; Justices of the United States Supreme Court; on numerous other occasions at the White House, the Kennedy Center, on Capitol Hill; for national and international television broadcasts; and in international concert tours and cultural exchanges. World Children's Choir, a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit organization, was founded in 1990 by its current artistic directors, Sondra Harnes and James Selway; Rosalind Patterson, Board Chair; Judith Penniman, Secretary. The choir offers rehearsal and performance training in voice and opera, and performance opportunities for children and teens ages 4 – 18 who live in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. World Children's Choir singers' special event highlights include U.S. Presidential Inaugural Event: The National Day of Service; Moms Rising Gathering: Turning Sadness Into Action, U.S. Congress; three performances for our nation's greatest heroes at the Congressional Medal of Honor Dinner, Library of Congress and other venues; performances of The Lord of the Rings at Wolf Trap; the National Vigil for Victims of Gun Violence at the Washington National Cathedral; the Marshall Legacy Institute Clearing the Path Gala; National Association of Corporate Directors Board Leadership Conference: Beyond Borders; and a Millennium Stage Concert as part of the Kennedy Center Voices of Our Nation Festival. Beginning September 2022, we offer both online and in person rehearsals using JackTrip Labs technology and server. Private voice lessons continue online only. Each season concert will be given two times. Once in person, and once online, streamed to YouTube. Students living within 300 - 500 miles of the Washington, DC area can attend our rehearsals virtually in Zoom using JackTrip technology for low-latency high quality audio, allowing for real-time interaction and performance. Students in the DC area can attend in person and/or virtual rehearsals.

Sondra Harnes, Founder and Artistic Director, is a lyric soprano, pianist, and conductor. She is a magna cum laude graduate of Southeast Missouri State University. She was awarded a full-tuition scholarship by the Juilliard School and received her Master of Music from The Catholic University of America. Ms. Harnes is a winner of many contests and awards, including a National Federation of Music Clubs I.P.F.A.C. opera scholarship, the St. Louis Symphony Young Artist Auditions, the Music Teachers National Association Collegiate Artist Auditions, three Minna Kaufmann Ruud Scholarships, the Metropolitan Opera St. Louis District and Midwest Region Auditions, three Metropolitan Opera National Council grants and a diploma from the Concours Internationale de Chants de Paris. She was appointed as Artist-in-Residence in the St. Paul, Minnesota school system. Ms Harnes has performed on radio and television and has appeared as soloist with numerous symphony orchestras and choral/oratorio societies. She assumed solo performance roles with the Aspen Festival, American Opera Center and the Garden State, St. Paul, Cincinnati and Sokol opera associations. Ms. Harnes performed in pops concerts at the United Nations and Carnegie Recital Hall. Ms. Harnes was one of the first Suzuki Piano teachers in the Washington, DC area and was a founding director of the Greater Washington Suzuki Piano institute. Ms. Harnes has also been a private coach and accompanist for singers associated with the St. Paul, Washington and Metropolitan Opera Associations. She has given private lessons and master classes in voice and Suzuki Piano, and conducted choirs throughout the United States, Canada, and Bermuda. In March of 1990, Ms. Harnes founded the World Children's Choir. She conducts seasonal concerts and special event performances, and has produced five compact disks for the World Children's Choir and three recordings that help children learn to sing.

James Jillson Selway, Associate Director, is a graduate of The Juilliard School and The Catholic University of America. Mr. Selway is President of Harnes Selway Arts, Falls Church, Virginia, where he maintains a Suzuki piano studio of over 35 students. He has directed operetta and music theater productions for the Harnes Selway Arts summer program, Singers Onstage. He is organist and Youth and Children's Choir director at St. Peter's Episcopal Church, Arlington, Virginia. As a piano clinician specializing in Suzuki Piano, Mr. Selway has taught at Ithaca College, Summer Music Fest - Suzuk Kingston, and at workshops in the United States, Canada, and in Bermuda. As a baritone, Mr. Selway has sung with Washington Opera, the Sokol Opera, and in concerts at the Aspen Music Festival and at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art. He has traveled in Israel, the Caribbean. Mr. Selway is the composer of many pieces for voice, treble and mixed chorus, and for solo piano. "With One Dream," written after September 11, 2001, has been recorded by the World Children's Choir and has been published by Warner Brothers. He has composed many songs for World Children's Choir, and for both adult and youth choirs at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Arlington, VA where he is the organist and youth choir director. Mr. Selway has performed Ambassador Drosselmeyer in BalletNova's production of The Nutcracker since 2005. He has also done music theater workshops throughout the US, in Canada, and in Bermuda. For many years he has directed music theater classes and performances for children, teens, and adults at the Ogontz Suzuki Institute in Lisbon, New Hampshire. For over twenty years he directed and produced Gilbert and Sullivan operettas at Summer Music Fest – Suzuki Kingston, Kingston, Ontario.

John Selway, WCC's advisor is all things related to audio, video, and internet technology since the beginning of the global pandemic quarantine. John, who was taught to sing by his mother when he was only ten months old, studied piano and violin from a very early age though his high school graduation. His main interests have always been in electronic music. He attended Purchase College, State University of New York. From the early 1990s to the present, John has built a high quality catalog of productions, both on his own and as a collaborator in various artist and label projects. From his first electronic band Chaotic Sound Matrix, to his major contributions to the early productions of Deep Dish; from his first success in the techno world as part of the seminal New York duo Disintegrator to the most successful of his collaborations, Smith & Selway, and his deep and minimal techno label CSM; from the intelligent electro-funk of Synapse and Serotonin, the electro and synth-pop of Memory Boy to the wild improvisational eclecticism of the Rancho Relaxo Allstars, John has created and helped to create one of the most stylistically wide ranging bodies of work in the world of electronic dance music. World Children's Choir (and his parents) are very grateful that John has supported the choir and the singers for the past three years. Without him there would be no choir, and no concert today.

Longing to sing with his church choir, he tried a variety of virtual choir recording methods but found each one too tedious and challenging to use. So he built EasyVirtualChoir as a simpler way to sing together — a way to easily create virtual choir videos with hundreds of musicians without needing to learn any fancy video or audio editing software.

Today, over 100,000 people around the world have used EasyVirtualChoir to make music together. From kindergarten Ukulele ensembles, to high school orchestras, to 50-person church choirs, to Happy Birthday celebrations, Easy Virtual Choir has been a source of joy and connection to countless families, classrooms, churches, and friend groups.
